

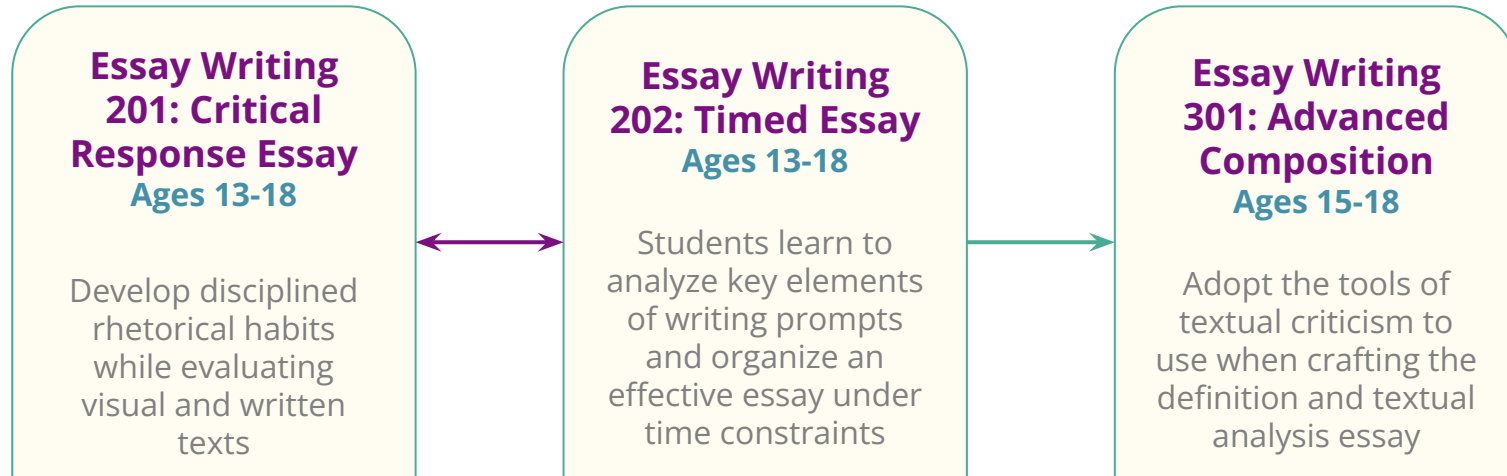
# WHAT'S NEXT? LATE HIGH SCHOOL
